## BUZZ SANDPIT "WHAT DID I GIVE UP FOR LENT?"

"Nothing." I rather embarked on a pilgrimage – a life-long pilgrimage. There is no destination, it is rather moving in a direction. A way of life illuminated by Scripture as the psalmist says in Psalm #119:105, "Truth's shining light guides me in my choices and decisions; the revelation of your word makes my pathway clear. " [ERV] I expect some discomfort and maybe some pain along the way. But did Jesus not say as much? John 16:33b "... In the world you will have trouble, but be courageous—I have overcome the world!" [ISV]

But what is this path which I have started upon? Why am I filled with fear and trepidation? My journey is to become an anti-racist South African – "Ndingum Afrika", (I am an African.)

Why? It all started with cricket. (I bet that surprised you. You thought I would say a prayer. Prayer followed, but initially, it was cricket.)

Do you recall that Quentin de Kock was admonished and praised for not 'bending the knee' according to the dicta from the Cricket SA (CSA)? People saw De Kock as either a hero or a foe, depending upon their persuasion. Then he buckled and did bend to financial and political pressure. I was disappointed. Why? Months before this incident, in response to questions asked by some of the congregation, I had looked into the BLM and CRT growing movements. (That's another story for another day.) However, while praying about what to present for the Wednesday evening Lenten devotions, De Kock's capitulation came to mind because, to my mind, it is all about racism. I believed that South Africa had handled their race relations quite well - far better than America has, but not as well as Scotland!

Within a few days of my contemplations, Saint Michael's Anglican church contacted me to ask if I would be available to lead their Sunday Services during lent. I asked them if I would be allowed to preach a series on "Giving up racism for Lent." They agreed. And so my journey to a new land began.

I have slowly, ever so slowly edged out of the "Fear Zone" into the "Learning zone". (Where I am more afraid.) It is a time of questioning my long-held beliefs and praxis. A time constant consulting of Scripture to hear what God has to say about the race which He created in His image.

What would it take to get you to join me on this pilgrimage? "Why should I?" Is probably your question. I do not know! But if you would like to chat about becoming an anti-racist person, let's do coffee sometime.

#### **APP REVIEW** (Bill Brander)

I am constantly trying to stay awake to new android apps which will aid me in my spiritual growth. Googleplay store is chock-a-block with such apps. I would like to share my experience with two of them, just in case you too are ever searching for ways to grow closer to God through prayer.



**"The Bible In One Year"** app comes from Nicky and Pipa Gumbel. It comes in two versions. The main version, consists of three daily passages of Scripture. (Wisdom, Old Testament, and New Testament readings.) Following each reading there is a commentary and short prayer. Possibly because there are Old Testament scriptures the Old Testament reading is the longest reading. [And I must confess that I sometimes scan through these readings – to my peril!] For example we are reading the Book of Numbers now. Did you know that there is a "test" and a subsequent sacrifice for jealousy? Numbers 5:29 "This is the ceremony that must take place at my altar when a husband suspects that his wife has been unfaithful. The priest must have the woman stand in my presence and carefully follow these instructions." [CEV]

There is what they call a "light version" of the app, but being concerned that Gumbel may have been 'cherry picking' verses to suit his commentary, after a couple of weeks I opted for the full version.

Pipa has very little to add at the end of the devotion, and I rarely read her input.

#### "Lectio365"

I only recently stumbled upon. To my mind it clips in the "Emotional Healthy Spiritually" (EHS) course which we have

run at NMC.

#### The app says of itself:

"TRY SOMETHING ANCIENT – Lectio 365 is inspired by Lectio Divina, a way of meditating on the Bible that's been used by Christians for centuries.

SHAPE YOUR FAITH – Explore how to love God through prayer and creativity, love others through justice and hospitality, and love the world through mission and learning. (Matt. 22:34-40 & Matt. 28:18-20)

SPECIAL SEASONS – Be inspired to pray through Advent, Lent and current events with hosts from around the world.

Two things I really like about this app is, as stated above, it aligns with the liturgical calendar, and the other are the prayer at the end.







# CHILDREN'S CHURCH

We managed to raise an amazing amount of physical and financial resources for this organisation, as well as being able to create more of an awareness of who they are and how they serve the community which will hopefully lead to long-term support for them.

In term 2 we faced a number of interruptions with the many public holidays and long weekends, but are pleased to see the Children's Church attendance continue to grow. In April the children were part of a special Palm Sunday service in the sanctuary and shared what they had learnt in Children's Church so far. Their palm waving and excitement for Easter added such a wonderful joy to the service as they joined in for worship.

This term we explored Discipleship throughout the Bible and learnt how to apply it to our everyday lives in practical ways. Our outreach focus has been Hilltop Animal Shelter who do amazing work in the lives of so many special creatures by rescuing, sheltering, feeding and homing unwanted or stray animals. Once again, we have been able to make a substantial donation of pet food, pet supplies and financial contributions thanks to the support of our amazing congregation, a huge thanks to all who donated.

#### **Junior Youth**

This year we were finally able to re-launch Junior Youth at NMC and in all honesty the first few weeks were slow. We had 4 children attending each week and a number of disruptions due to long weekends and public holidays. Nevertheless we went into Term 2 determined to get Junior Youth off the ground. With the assistance of Matthew Tarboton in family ministry and a number of helpers spreading the news of Junior Youth we reached lift off. All Glory to God we now have a Junior Youth of minimum 25 kids every Friday evening ready for fun and to learn more about Jesus. Please continue to pray into this area as we trust for further growth and the involvement of parents in the youth and our church.

#### **Senior Youth**

God has blessed us with a vibrant and stable senior youth group, our numbers range between 35 and 45 on a weekly basis.

The end of term 1 saw us hold the first stay awake since the arrival of Covid 19, we attracted 80 teens and made a 75-litre milkshake which was a massive success (excuse the pun), we have tackled topics like the armour of God, know your enemy, let go of the trash in your life so you can hold on to God, and many, many more topics that are current in the lives of young people.

The second term has continued with a number of challenging topics as well as fellowship and enjoyment, with more kids bringing new friends on a Friday evening, as well as many breaking out of their shells and coming into their own as young adults, and future youth probi –leaders.

Senior youth has become a training ground for young leaders and a source of Beach mission team members, Junior Youth leaders, as well as Holiday Club leaders! This is so important as these are the future leaders of church and business in our communities.

It is always great when parents become more involved in youth and their children's activities, and as we hope to grow young families in our congregation, we aim to host a number of parent-child youth get togethers in the weeks to come. #### Firehouse

Firehouse has been launched and I am excited to see the real hunger in the youth to grow spiritually. This amazing group meets most Sunday afternoons for a planned session of learning God's Word through a range of materials, such as the Youth Alpha course, examining and unpacking popular Christian songs and lyrics, as well as sharing life experiences. We have a number of Young Adults who assist each week in running the Firehouse sessions and ministering into the young people's lives. The group is just on 20 strong and are really comfortable with each other which makes it easier to tackle difficult topics. I look forward to giving more feedback on this group as the year progresses, we are hoping to have a Firehouse camp and at the end of the year confirmation for a number of the group.

#### **Beach Mission**

Praise God for another successful beach mission this April, despite the rain! Even though this shorter trip was only a week long, the growth that I saw in the 12 kids who joined was amazing. They started leading devotions, morning sessions, and needed no encouragement mixing with the holiday makers and local children as well. This time we were able to interact with a number of the parents as well who were super responsive and supportive of the team. Despite there not being a beach mission in June/ July, the hotel has asked us to place someone with them to run their children's club during these holidays. We thank all those involved and parents of team members for your continued support of this amazing ministry. We look forward to our next Beach Mission in December!

#### **Holiday Club**

We cannot wait for this amazing ministry to begin once more. Nahoon Methodist partner up with Vincent Methodist and St Nicholas Church to host a week of holiday club in the July school holidays. Holiday club presents an array of exciting positives. Firstly, it is an opportunity for young people to step up into leadership positions as they take care of their groups for the week. Children who may not normally have a safe place to be during the school holidays can instead be well looked after and learn about the love of Jesus for the week, hopefully returning home with the Good News for the rest

#### **CHURCH ACITIVITY**

We are almost halfway through 2022 and what a busy year it has been! The church building is once again abuzz with activity on a weekly basis, from support group meetings, to worship practices, life groups, junior and senior youth, multiple Sunday services, ladies teas and fundraisers. Praise God!

With the COVID restrictions reduced and church activities on their way to 'normal' once again, we changed our service times to 8am and 9:30am on a Sunday morning, with children's church at the 9:30am Service. This has been especially welcome with the colder winter mornings setting in.

One such weekly activity is on a Monday evening at 7pm in the church chapel. A support group run by the Koinonia Rehabilitation Centre for addicts. This group invites families and loved ones to meet together for a time of support and sharing through the difficult process of the rehabilitation of a loved one.

On a Wednesday evening at 6pm there is an AA (Addicts Anonymous) group which meets in the church chapel and is lead by a trained AA leader, which guides those struggling with addiction through a step-programme as well as offering a time of sharing and support.

Once a month the ladies have their ladies' tea fellowship in the church hall at 11am where they spend time together in fellowship, enjoy some light eats, entertainment and sharing in God's Love.

Pray with us on a Monday and Friday Morning at 8am as we lift up friends, family, church, community. City, country and global issues to the only One who can solve them.

Friday Nights are youth night with Junior Youth beginning at 5:15pm until 6:30pm for ages 6 to 12. After which Senior Youth begins from 7 until 9:30pm for ages 13 to 20.

Throughout the week there are a number of Life Groups who meet for fellowship and spiritual growth through studying God's Word. Feel free to contact the office to find out which group would be a great fit for you if you aren't already part of a Life Group.

After considering a few applications, the Trust approved sponsorship of a Grade 5 pupil for 2021. The Trust looks forward to seeing her right through school, to Matric one day, as in spite of circumstances she is a bright student.

# NMC FINANCIAL CHECK-IN

As June approaches and the reality that the first half of 2022 is almost up, it is a good time to reflect on our financial position at NMC.

The events and circumstances which many businesses at present are experiencing are also being felt in our financial position to date.

We began the year with a very tight budget which provided very little leeway or cushioning for unexpected events. This situation was brought about because of the last two years, driven mainly by the pandemic, of our planned giving and collections not increasing by much, while at the same time our expenses increasing by a greater percentage.

NMC spends the bulk of their receivable income on salaries. By doing this, we are able to employ staff who provide various services to the community and are involved in many outreaches and missionary work.

So far this year we have found ourselves falling slowly behind on our budgeted targets as each month our expenses exceed our income. Some small unforeseen expenses have also crept in which have needed to be attended to.

As we enter the second half of the year, we appeal to our members to relook at the Planned Giving program. If you are already a part of this program then please carefully pray around increasing your commitment. And for those who are not on the program, for you to commit to prayer the possibility of joining this program. Please contact the office should you wish to find out more about PLANNED GIVING.

There are other ways in which you can assist NMC in improving their current financial position. Our banking details are available should you wish to do an EFT for any collections or donations. The church has a Zapper account which allows you to make payments while at church on a Sunday should you not have cash for the collection bowl.

As the leadership of NMC we thank you, our members, for your continued loyal support and financial commitment during very difficult times.
